



Raff Angus returns to the spring selling season with commitment...

With any move, and perhaps enhanced by such a move to King Island, it takes a few years to understand a new environment and a new management system. With our relocation, management readjustment and in some way herd re-build we were not in the position or location to continue with annual on-property bull sales. For the first four years we sold bulls privately from the paddock. This suited some, particularly for those who wanted to visit the island, but it soon became hard for us to manage the order of inspection fairly for our clients. The past two years saw us quietly return to the public auction system but did not allow us to return to our professional ways of the past when in Queensland.

Our Monday August 23rd Pedigrees with a Difference with Performance on the Hook Spring Celebration Sale is the beginning of a new chapter for us. We are excited to combine the two sales, in two different states

on the one day. Why... Returning to Queensland was never dismissed for a bull sale however we had not exactly planned on being able to re—access our magnificent selling complex at Drillham — to the Milson Family we are truly appreciative. Having bred bulls in Queensland for fifty years it is exciting to return after a 5—year absence. This will allow past northern clients easy access to our program's genetics.

Our return is with commitment — not a one off — and we look forward to catching up with familiar faces on sale day. The female sale is the celebration sale. This offering truly celebrates the past 56 years breed—ing direction of stud founder David with the support of Jilly. Whilst we have not overlooked the market interest in the north for our females, we wanted to showcase Dad's dedication of breed type to those who have not often seen them. Holding a sale at Walwa allows for them to be displayed during the Southern Beef Week on day 1 Monday 26th of July.

Raff Angus Bulls that sell

Moving into such a contrastingly different environment has given question by many fellow breeders as to whether we have changed both our breeding direction and breed type. The answer is no. If anything, with the hundreds of steer brothers processed over recent years with individual carcass feedback received, it has confirmed that weight continues to be the ultimate driver of profitability. Good heads, strong muzzles with masculine bodies of beef hanging on sound footed and strong boned structure continue to appeal to us. This sale draft are a combination of spring and autumn born bulls most of which are sired by home bred bulls genetically varied to the mainstream. The United Kingdom, the home of Aberdeen Angus, has seen a recent genetic infusion into our herd. Following the Hoff Scotch Cap influence a number of years ago we have since found it hard to source bulls beyond a frame six in stature. Further we have not got caught up in the low birthweight, low mature cow weight industry belief which - we believe – has a natural diminishing effect on growth. In the UK market they want animals that grow fast and weigh heavy off grass - with due diligence we have found herds that mirror our program and have combined these nicely into our herd. Having arrived at Condamine mid-May this sale draft of bulls sell simply in age order. We will not be printing individual photos of bulls within the catalogue. Instead, all lots will be videoed with these available 2 to 3 weeks prior to sale on our website or online selling platforms. With my parents' retirement I'm hoping most will personally attend sale day to celebrate with them their lifetime in agriculture dedicated to breeding Angus Seedstock for the Australian Beef Industry.


females as it is exciting for us to offer these lots of such quality and wish the eventual purchaser's every success with their breeding decisions. There are numerous modern bulls that these females will carry. How often do you see top end cows sell into other leading seedstock producers' herds then have them go on to breed highly acclaimed and well industry accepted progeny? I truly believe these cows can do that. They are all big volumed sound footed individuals with the front-end neck extension and smoothness of shoulders that our Raff program is well known for. They have been catalogued in an order that best places each potential purchaser the opportunity to get the females of their choice. They will be on display Day 1 of the Southern Beef Week Open Day Monday 26th July. They sell first on Monday However, we have no 23rd August. I will be in attendance for the open day so hope to see regrets selling such those interested on this day.

Performance on the Hook

Full brothers to our rising two-year-old sale bulls selling August 23rd were processed through the JBS Longford Plant Tasmania in late June. These were the complete group of spring born steers and represented the bottom 50% of all male calves born in that contemporary. With an average age of 21 months, they boasted an average carcase weight of 355kg. Comparing these 59 Raff bred steers Nationally against the 2,211 bodies processed that same day - steers only, no HGP, Grass Fed, Ossification <230 - our steers had more marbling, more fat, a higher MSA Index and, with the same ossification score, a 35-kilogram heavier carcase weight. At that day's grid of \$7.40 it equated to \$259 per carcase more value or nearly \$10,000 extra for the two-deck trailer load. The complete consignment averaged \$2,638 per head (topping at \$3,273) with a two-deck trailer load of 38 steers grossing \$100,245.


Performance on the Hook

The 12—month processing period from June 2020 to June 2021 saw 1,041,003 bodies of beef processed nationally within a No HGP, Grass Fed, either sex, and ossification score <230 sorting selection. Two hundred and sixty of these were Raff Angus steers and heifers fattened and finished on farm prior to being ferried across to either the JBS, Longford or Greenham, Smithton Tasmanian processing plants.

Below are some interesting Raff Angus v National, 12-month average comparisons :

	Raff Angus	National
Carcass Weight	351kg	299kg
Marble Score	1.3	1.0
Index Av	61.34	59.98
Fat Av.	9mm	7mm

With the same ossification average these 290 Raff Angus steer and heifers processed during the past 12–month period yielded a 52–kilo–gram heavier carcase weight or 15% more. At say a \$6/kg carcase weight average value these bodies equated to over \$300 more profit per carcase.

Performance in the Feedlot

Steers sired by Raff Angus bulls excelled at the recent Barcoo Feedlot Challenge. Congratulations to Eli and Michelle Vogel on the success of their steer exhibits where, after 100 days on feed at the Rodgers Creek Feedlot outside Warwick, they were rewarded with the following accolades:

- \cdot Highest Aggregate Weight Gain for vendor bred cattle & Overall Aggregate Weight Gain Champion with their pen group average gain of 2.92 kg/day
- · Single Animal Weight Gain Champion Exhibit with the steer gaining an incredible 3.96kg/day after 100 days on feed.

After spirited bidding the steers sold at \$2196 delivered and cleared tick free to Moura Saleyards. They were sold to Nullamanna Feedlot Inverell N.S.W. This follows on from their success in 2019 at the RNA Paddock to Palate Competition where they gained first place for MSA Eating Quality Index for Aggregate pen of six steers. Since their first purchase in 2004 they have been loyal supporters of our program with near 70 bulls purchased over the years for use in their herd at Blackwater in Central Queensland.
